Job Title: WASH Technician

Number of Posts: 1

Duty station: Rwenzori Region

Overall purpose of the job: To coordinate the operation, implementation and monitoring of the WASH and IWRM infrastructure interventions within JESE's Program

Specific responsibilities:

- Develop community strategies and approaches that empower and ensure involvement of the target program beneficiaries in planning, project execution, monitoring and reporting
- Conduct feasibility studies and technical assessments for construction of WASH and IWRM infrastructure
- Develop designs and bills of quantities for WASH/IWRM Infrastructure and launch tender bidding procedures for construction.
- Develop clear infrastructure monitoring tools, Supervise and provide technical advice to masons and site workers during construction work and installation of equipment
- Develop technical resources (eg strategic framework, standard operating procedures and manuals to guide JESE's WASH and IWRM interventions drawing from international best practices along with field specific observations
- Ensure that all WASH and IWRM Infrastructure data is well managed and provides an accurate representation of the reality on the ground
- Oversee construction, verify the quality and quantity of construction materials for contracted infrastructure
- Keep up to date with changes in regulatory framework and maintain awareness of current environmental issues

- Conduct water quality studies to identify and characterize water pollutant sources and carry out water treatment processes
 - Facilitate the process of development of construction, operation and maintenance plans at every site
 - Document key advocacy issues, best practices and beneficiary case studies and disseminate information on WASH/IWRM infrastructure development and use.
 - Write concept papers and proposals to provide input to the fundraising and resource mobilization strategy
 - Liaise with local government institutions and technical staff to plan and implement IWRM activities in selected catchments
 - Prepare operational plans, budgets, periodic quality assurance and project progress reports
